Pillar 1 - Every Child Every Day

Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds

1. Continue to strive to implement a free, full day kindergarten program for all students across the district:
 - The ability to have all students begin their academic career on a level playing field will pay dividends throughout their school years.

2. Continue to develop and support the social-emotional learning and needs of students in our school, working collaboratively with the exSEL team and network:
 - Create and expand the exSEL team to include multiple team members from our school.
 - Continue to work with and support our counseling staff with expanding SEL strategies.
 - Continue to train all staff through specific trainings and Professional Development on the importance of SEL and how to infuse it into all aspects of our school.
 - Introduce conversations of the CASEL competencies across all classrooms to all students.
 - Embed SEL age/grade appropriate benchmarks into all conversations (STAT, PLC, IEP/504 meetings, RTI)
 - Continue to emphasize Growth Mindset theory with students and provide focused PD for staff.
 - Add full time Mental Health specialist for elementary schools.
 - Renewal of Responsive Classroom practices and professional development.
 - Solidify programs and transitions between grade levels and schools.

Pillar 2 - A Cohesive PreK-12 System of Teaching and Learning

Engaged and Successful Students; Independent Learners

1. Participation of grade level teams in implementing new math curriculum.
 - Provide staff with professional development, as well as time to discuss the implementation process within the building and across the district.
 - Utilize grade level assessments to measure attainment of standards, as well as meaningful and engaging problem solving skills.

2. Participation of grade level teams in piloting literacy programs.
 - Provide staff with a protocol for evaluating pilots, as well as time to discuss programs within the building and across the district.
 - Look for program with grade level assessments to measure attainment of standards, as well as a meaningful, engaging and authentic literacy component.

3. Work with Elementary Curriculum Director to create a calendar for regular and systemic curriculum review, grade level assessment windows and regular data review.

4. Continue to expand technology K-5
 - Attain additional technology resources to support learning at all grade levels.
 - Provide learning opportunities for teachers to develop technology integration skills.

Pillar 3 - Safe and Secure Schools

1. Develop a cyclical plan for implementation, practice and review of safety protocols.

2. Develop and execute effective plans, procedures, routines and operational systems:
 - Improve audio communication in gym and cafeteria.
 - Work with Operations to improve the climate in the building by installing air conditioner units in classrooms and industrial fans in the cafeteria and the gym.
